tous time, as India and Japan are celebrating the 70th anniversary of the establishment of diplomatic relations Since the signing of the peace treaty on April 28, 1952, the India-Japan relationship has evolved into a special strategic and global partnership, expanding across all conceivable domains and disciplines.

The COVID-19 pandemic has posed challenges, as well as provided new opportunities. The government of India has taken proactive steps to tackle challenges posed by the disruptive pandemic and achieved several milestones on Jan. 8. India crossed the significant milestone of 1.5 billion vaccinations. It has entered the next phases of vaccinating its youth and delivering booster shots, and India restarted exports of indigenously produced vaccines in November. We are committed to delivering low-cost, effective, and safe vaccines to the developing world in keeping with its spirit of rasuddian kutubamkam (the world is one family).

one family). The India-Japan special strategic and global partnership is based on the strong foundation of such shared values as democracy, freedom and respect for the rule of law. Our strategic partnership is reflected in a vast array of institutional mechanisms, including annual summits and "two-plus-two" ministerial dialogues Japan is a natural partner in India's infra-

structure development and Japan-supported projects, including the Delhi Metro
and Mumbai-Ahmedabad High Speed Rail
using shinkansen technology, are among
the most iconic infrastructure projects in
India. To explore the potential complementarities of our demographics, India
and Japan recently agreed on a basic partmership framework for a Specified Skilled
Worker program.
With its demographic asset of 650 million skilled young workers, India continues to take proactive steps to maintain its
high-growth trajectory toward the goal
of becoming a \$5 trillion economy. Policy
reforms and initiatives undertaken by
the government include the privatization of public-sector units, a \$1.4 trillion
National Infrastructure Pipeline project,
a National Monetization Pipeline for
Jerson Bald Assets works \$50,billion and a National Monetization Pipeline for brown field assets worth \$80 billion, and production-linked incentive schemes cov ering 13 sectors of the economy. These are being undertaken to increase economic efficiency, improve return on assets and

bolster the manufacturing sector. India and Japan are combining their strength and competitiveness to coinnovate, cocreate and coproduce for both domestic and global markets to make this vision a reality. Important initiatives such as the India-Japan Industrial Partnership, Digital Partnership and Supply Chain Resilience Initiative are focused on results oriented outcomes for ensuring mutually beneficial economic security. These capacity-building and economic development frameworks enable synergies between Japan's Society 5.0 and Green Growth Strategy plans, and India's Aatmanirbhar Bharat — "Self reliant India," "Make in India," "Djitatl India," "Startup India" and "Skill India" initiatives. With rapidly increasing active internet and smartphone users in India, opportunities in foruite rechologies capacity outplies. martphone users in India, opportunities in frontier technologies such as artificial intelligence, 5G and beyond, the Internet of Things, big data analytics, quantum computing, digitization and more seem promising. It is pertinent to note that India is home to the third-largest start-up ecosys tem in the world (with more than 60,000

start-ups) and is emerging as a global hub for innovation. India envisions a free, open and inclu sive Indo-Pacific, based on the principle of security and growth for all in the region Japan already leads the trade, connectiv-

Partner coun tries are committed to taking forward the vision of "the Quad" in key and strategic areas, including vaccines, climate change critical and emerging technologies, quality infrastructure development, space, cyber education and people-to-people coopera tion for a secure, peaceful, prosperous and stable Indo-Pacific

At COP 26 in Glasgow, Scotland, India announced that it will achieve the target of net-zero emissions by 2070 and reiterated its com-mitment to take its nonfossil energy capacitation mitment to take its nonfossil energy capac ity to 500 gjawatts and meet 50% of its energy requirements from renewable energy by 2050. India remains a strong votary of climate mitigation and climate justice. In 2021 alone, India launched various clean energy initiatives, including the National Green Hydrogen Mission and an initiative with the United Kingdom — the Green Grids — One Sun One World One

ful use of nuclear energy. India-Japan relations are historical and civilizational. Buddhism has been one of the key factors in maintaining the cultural connection between the countries for cen uries. The Support, Advocacy and Mental Health Interventions for Children in Vulnerable Circumstances and Distress series of conferences is an important platform for showcasing the cultural linkages between India and Japan. In modern times, the prac tice of yoga and the Ayurvedic traditional system of Indian medicine in Japan have sustained this civilizational bond, which is being strengthened with people-to-people

# Golden age for economic growth



Celebrating friendgrowing mutual dependence, India and Japan mark the 70th anniversary of their diplomatic relations in 2022, infusing new energy and renewed aware

ness among their peoples

Japanese celebrate longevity, or koki, age 70 is reached. The color of the koki celebration is purple, which has long been a noble and virtuous color.

Among monarchies, the platinum jubilee is a celebration of the 70th anniversary, marking the beginning of the golden years of Japanese-Indian relations.

In my 56 years, I have personally witnessed the triumphs and accomplishments in the peaking of Japan and the rise of India as a superpower.

India is one of the fastest emerging and leading economies of the decade. According to a report by Oxford Economics based on annual gross domestic product growth, all 10 of the world's fastest growing cities across the globe will be in India.

The India Space Research Organization set a world record by launching 104 satellites into orbit in a single mission. The Mangalyan, Indias Mars orbiter, was made possible at the cheapest cost worldwide and has celebrated over 1,000 days in orbit so far, Japanese-Indian ocoperation in sci-

ence and technology is an active catalyst for joint research. Most recently, the Department of Physics at the Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Learning's Prashanthi Nilayam teamed up with Noriyoshi Matsumi, a team leader at the Japan Advanced Institute of Science and Technology, to develop anode fabrication for extremely fast-charging lith-

ium-ion batteries suitable for use in electric vehicles. Much shorter charging times will attract consumers to EVs rather than gas oline-based vehicles, ultimately leading to cleaner environments in major cities across India is also accelerating efforts toward

the "blue economy." The deep ocean mis-sion is to explore the mineral wealth in sion is to explore the finiterial wealth in the sea and thermal energy in seawater, which may lead to huge developments in the Indian economy. The Indian Scientists Association in Japan, jointly with Tokai University's School of Marine Science and Techversity's School of Manne Science and Tech-nology, recently organized a symposium on ocean science and rechnology heralding a new paradigm for India's blue economy. India has given the world the math behind zero, trigonometry, calculus and many more groundbreaking inventions and discoveries.

India is home to the world's largest under-25 population, putting young people at the helm of decision-making and vibrant partic-ipation in sports, wherein India's best-ever seven medals were achieved last year at the Tokyo Olympics. Using cutting-edge innovation and new technology, India excels in the manufacture and export of world-class products. The electronics manufacturing sector is sym-bolic of exporting mobile phones worth India is home to the world's largest under

billions of dollars. India has launched its first domestically built aircraft carrier, the INS Vikrant, and manufactures its own fighter aircraft and submarines, showing the lence and immense capability of its domestic manufacturing. Former Prime Minister Yoshihide Suga

stated that he hoped to further develop cooperation in areas such as cyber, digital, decarbonization, health care and connectivity, and also mentioned possible collaboration in such fields as 5G, submarine cables, industrial competitiveness, supply chain diversification, development of India's North Eastern Region and the Specified Skilled Worker system. Massive government-led reforms and

structural changes have been implemented to build the platform for the making of a New India and the world's third-largest economy. A recent study predicts that digi tal transformation will add \$154 billion to India's GDP, increasing the growth rate by 1% annually. The COVID-19 pandemic has opened even greater potential for Japan-India cooperation.

To mark the 70th anniversary, a series of

To mark the 70th anniversary, a series of events are being organized by the Indian Commerce and Industry Association Japan and the India Foundation across Japan for students and society at large.
